Who's eligible to sign up for the Adult Basic Education Programs?

- ◆ Mississippi residents, 17 years of age or older, that are not enrolled in high school.

What are the costs of the Programs?

- ◆ Classes for GED, Computer Skills, Basic Skills, Employment Skills, and other classes are free to the public. All programs are funded by the Mississippi State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

What are the benefits of participating in Adult Education Program?

- ◆ The Adult Education Programs offer training that will enhance one's opportunities in obtaining and retaining employment. Most employers require a high school diploma or GED, and also some basic computer knowledge. These programs assist individuals in obtaining those goals.
- ◆ If you receive your GED through our ABE/GED Program you may receive one semester free (tuition only).

When are classes offered?

- ◆ Classes are offered both day and night at various locations throughout the counties in which we serve. Since these course offerings change according to the needs in an area, it is best to call a GED program nearest you. A list of GED programs is printed on the back of this brochure.

May a person attend class who already has a GED or high school diploma?

- ◆ YES!!! This program is open to help anyone who wants to improve his/ her basic skills. These classes will help individuals prepare for test, so they may improve their chances of employment or retain their employment.
