Coahoma Community College Launches New Short-Term Certified Clinical Medical Assistant Program

Coahoma Community College is now offering a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) program—a short-term, hybrid training designed to prepare students for careers in healthcare.

The program includes evening classes twice a week, online modules, and a three-week clinical externship. Students will gain skills in both administrative and clinical tasks and become eligible to earn national certifications in medical assisting, phlebotomy, and EKG.


Leflore qualified for the national stage after placing third in Business Communication at the state-level FBLA competition—an achievement earned by only the top three competitors in each category.
