Course Description:

This course is designed to assist students in developing an appreciation and conceptual understanding of the major art forms: (drawing, architecture, sculpture, painting, ceramics, photography, graphics, and crafts. Three hours: 3 credits.

Student Learning Outcomes:

**Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to do the following:**

1. Analyze fundamental art movements throughout world history.
2. Identify well known artists and art works throughout history.
3. Explain basic meanings of well known pieces of artwork throughout history.
4. Define vocabulary of art terms.
5. Compare the use of art mediums.
6. Discuss controversies over restoration of famous art works.
7. Compare how art functions in a society.

Attendance:

Absence from Class for School Sanctioned Activities

Students who are absent from class due to participation in an officially sanctioned school activity must present notice of the event to the instructor (at least one week prior is desirable) and request advance assignments. If the student is passing the course, the request for make-up will be honored.
