Course Description:

A survey course of the Renaissance to the Twentieth Century. Special emphasis on modern expressions in fields of art. (Three hours: 3 credits.)

Student Learning Outcomes:

**Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to do the following:**

1. Identify well known artists' works and their artistic style.
2. Interpret aesthetic sensibilities for human creativity.
3. Compare how art functions in various societies and time periods throughout history.
4. Identify well known art works throughout history and their basic meaning and any controversy surrounding them.
5. Generalize basic artistic schools and artists associated with them.
6. Define and explain vocabulary of art terms.
7. Summarize basic ideas behind movements throughout art history.

Attendance:

Regular class attendance and punctuality are expected. All arrangements for completing missed work are to be made with the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to initiate these arrangements.

Excessive absences may result in loss of credit for the course concerned as well as loss of grant refund and/or financial aid eligibility.

The nature of the educational programs at Coahoma Community College is such that it is necessary for every student to attend class regularly. Instructors will keep accurate class records and those records will become part of the student's official record.

NOTE: In the event of inclement weather, the President may cancel classes. Students are advised to listen to the TV or radio for an announcement. Absence without an official closure is treated as an unexcused absence unless there is a danger for the student to drive.

#### Absence from Class for School Sanctioned Activities

Students who are absent from class due to participation in an officially sanctioned school activity must present notice of the event to the instructor (at least one week prior is desirable) and request advance assignments. If the student is passing the course, the request for make-up will be honored. If missing the class will endanger the student's academic success, the instructor will notify the activity sponsor; the sponsor and the instructor will determine a decision regarding the student's participation in the activity. In general, the decision will reflect the philosophy that students attend college for educational purposes, and participation in activities outside the classroom is recognized as a lower priority.

#### Make-up Policy:

No extra make up work will be given or graded. A student is expected to be in class to work. Students are expected to meet deadlines with the turning in of assignments or receive a grade of 0. No exceptions will be made and no excuses will be heard.

#### Cheating Policy/Plagiarism:

Cheating will not be tolerated. Cheating during a test or quiz will result in the student/students receiving a grade of 0. This policy also applies to a student allowing another student to cheat off of his or her paper.

Other disciplinary actions may also be taken.

#### Electronic Devices in Class:

The use of cellular phones, pagers, CD players, radios, and similar devices is prohibited in the classroom and laboratory facilities.

Method(s) of Evaluation:

Students will have a Quiz/handout for every chapter. These Quiz/handouts as well as other research and museum visits will reflect 75% of your grade. Quizzes will consist of written questions as well as visuals to write about so that the student can identify works of various artists studied. The other 25% will come from a mid term and an end of the semester exam. Class attendance may also reflect the final grade.

Students will also be asked to write a paper on a particular artist or school of artists that they find interesting. This paper will be averaged in with test grades.

Students will also be asked to visit a gallery or museum and give a written report about what they saw. These reports will also be given orally and averaged in with test grades.
