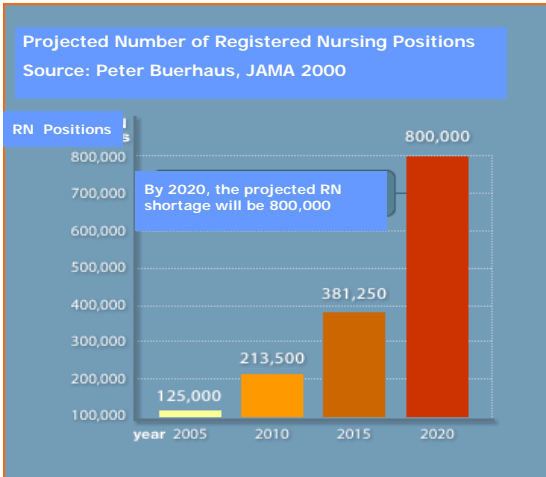


WHAT IS THE SUMMER NURSING RESIDENCY PROGRAM (SNRP)?

The Summer Nursing Residency Program (SNRP) is a two week-long program funded by the U.S. Department of Labor designed to give students a first-hand look at nursing through classroom experiences, clinical or shadowing experiences, hands-on practice, scavenger hunts, and on-campus living. In addition, students will receive training in certain nursing skills and complete CPR training.

Program Goals

SNRP Components

Component 1: Classroom Instruction



Students will receive classroom instruction relative to nursing careers. Classes will meet on a daily basis for one hour. Instruction will be provided in areas such as Nursing, Medical Terminology, College Algebra, and Anatomy & Physiology.

Component 2: Clinical Training

Students will receive clinical training during the program that will expose them to medical technology and practices that will enhance their interest in nursing careers.



Component 3: Recreational Activities

Recreational activities will be available to foster socialization. Activities include bowling, movies, cook-out, volleyball, an exciting field trip, etc.

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a graduating senior
- Must have a strong desire and interest in nursing career
- Must have a minimum of 2.75 (4.0 scale) or 3.75 (5.0 scale) grade point average

Application Process

Student must complete an application packet which will include:

- Application for SNRP
- Official high school transcript
- Essay/personal statement
- Two recommendation forms
- Two letters of recommendation

*Recommendation forms and letters must be completed by math or science teacher.
