




## Coahoma Community College Celebrates Spring Convocation



## Coahoma Community College Celebrates Student Academic Achievement

The Fall 2023 semester saw a total of 180 students at Coahoma Community College earn academic honors. To qualify for academic honors, students must be enrolled in 15 or more credit hours. The President's List recognizes full-time students who achieved a 3.75-4.0 grade point average (GPA) throughout the semester, while the Dean's List commends students who maintained a quality GPA of at least 3.5-3.74. This semester, 116 students earned recognition on the President's List, while 53 students made it onto the Dean's List.

#### **Education**

Mrs. Angela Reynolds completed her Bachelor of Science in Biology at Alcorn State University in Lorman, MS in May 1997. She then went on to earn a Master of Science in Natural Science with a focus on Biology Education from Delta State University in May 2000.



Since 2001, Mrs. Reynolds has been an instrumental part of Coahoma Community College, Clarksdale, MS as a Science Instructor. She teaches courses such as Anatomy and Physiology, Principles of Biology, and General Zoology to students enrolled in General Biology and Nutrition. Additionally, she has served as the Math and Science Club advisor and a student mentor. Mrs. Reynolds is also experienced in facilitating Online and Evening Courses using Learning Management systems like Canvas and Blackboard.

#### NASA/MS Space Grant Consortium Coordinator/Scholarship/Tutorial Program Coordinator (2007-2019):

Mrs. Reynolds became the Coordinator for the NASA/MS Space Grant Consortium in 2007, managing scholarships and tutoring services. She was the Campus Principal Investigator for NASA Consortium Grants and actively promoted Science, Mathematics, and Computer Technology Awareness. Mrs. Reynolds collaborated with local schools to provide tutoring services and oversaw a budget ranging from \$7,500.00 to \$25,000.00.

#### <u> Math and Science Enrichment Program Coordinator (2003-2006):</u>

From 2003 to 2006, Mrs. Reynolds organized and planned enrichment activities for local sixth-grade students, fostering an interest in STEM courses. She successfully managed a \$25,000.00 budget, supervised program faculty and staff, and developed partnerships with parents and local schools.

#### **Certifications**:

Mrs. Angela Reynolds holds a Mississippi Educator License, Class AA 181 Biology, Grades 7-12, earned in July 2000. She has also completed Online Teacher Training Certification in 2008 and Quality Matters Online Teacher Certification in April 2021.

#### Honors/Awards:

Mrs. Reynolds received the Faculty Member of the Month award in September 2018 and was recognized as the Mississippi Blood Service Blood Drive Chairperson of the Year in 2018. She celebrated 20 years of dedicated service at Coahoma Community College in 2023 and successfully completed the Mississippi Community College Leadership Academy in June 2021–2022.

#### **Professional Development:**

Mrs. Angela Reynolds has consistently pursued professional development opportunities, including certifications in MSVCC Enrollment Tool Instructor Training, Podcast Instructor as Recruiter, Podcast Persisting in Math, CCC Evidence Base Best Practices Faculty Series, and various podcasts and webinars focusing on student engagement, career counseling, and planning.
